The Viridis flumen (The Green River)

short drive to the northeast of Ibesikpo Asutan local government area, near the famed local breweries, lies the green river in Ikot Akpa village a 20 KM drive from the Airport.


Interestingly, this river originates from a rocky hill, which is greener in

dry seasons, but less green during the rainy season due to rainwater washing the soil down the hills into the river. Magically, this water when put into any plastic container appears white. The question is, why is the river green at sight but white when in a bottle?

With assumed answers such as; the river is green because it is mirroring the green palm fruit environment. Others, the river being filled with

algae were also considered. Nonetheless, these hypotheses may be inaccurate. Findings show there's a mystery behind the green river. Theologians believe it is the hand of God.

The month of June is a month of significant excitement for the Ibom Air family as it is the month that marked the beginning of their commercial flight operations. It's been three years already and we took the opportunity to sit with the $COO-George\ Uriesi\ who$ has been there from inception, to share with us how it all began.

How did it all begin?

hey say "nothing without first a dream". It all began as a dream from a visionary and purposeful Governor, thinking about how best to transform his State's economy from totally oil and government dependent, into a private sector driven, productive economy. His plan to do this involved an 'Industrialization Program' supported by a 'Visitors Program' both working together to create conditions for more people to visit the State for business opportunities as well as leisure travel.

Adopting existing success models such as Emirates and Ethiopian, he conceptualized Ibom Air as the vehicle to provide the muchneeded ease of access in and out of Akwa Ibom, to facilitate both programs. But not just that, he also saw the need for an airline as the critical 3rd leg of the tripod of major investments by the State Government in aviation, which include the Victor Attah International Airport and the world class Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) facility within the airport.

He could see clearly that without a well-run airline based at the airport, these critical and very expensive investments would struggle to be able to offer the 'high hopes' returns expected of them. Thus Ibom Air was born.

How do you feel about Ibom Air, 3 years later?

Thankful, mostly. Thankful to God for the modest success the brand has achieved thus far. Thankful to our Board, Management and Staff. Thankful to our Customers. Thankful to our Shareholder- the Government and people of Akwa Ibom State! Thankful to all Nigerians for the massive embrace of our brand. And thankful to all our stakeholders for their support.

But I also feel very hungry and impatient for us to get to the next stage and the next stage and the next stage...

How have you weathered the storm of the aviation industry so far?

This is an industry of tempestuous storms. One moment you're faced with the existential threat of a total lockdown due to a totally unforeseen pandemic. You think to yourself, "is it that we chose the wrong time to start"? Then you survive and soon start recovering only to experience #endsars! Again you manage to recover.

And then the price of aviation fuel suddenly takes you on a roller coaster ride where you find yourself

hanging on for dear life without a clear sense of how long it will last and how far it will go. All of these are not to mention the depreciating naira and unavailability of forex that the business depends on.

It has really been a hair-raising, roller coaster ride. But we have no intention of rolling over and dying anytime soon. We will just keep weathering it and working hard to succeed in spite of these obstacles.

All the awards, a fluke or an actual testament?

Personally, I don't take any of our awards for granted. Each award represents to me, a genuine mark of acknowledgment of our efforts, at the very least. But most importantly, as we receive them, each one of them reminds me that getting here has been the easy part. Its staying here that is the real heavy lifting. These awards encourage us to continue to ensure that Ibom Air maintains the high standards we have come to be known for.

What would you consider your major milestone?

Hmmm. I think apart from the modest successes we have achieved in various areas of our business (and I can quote numbers for you), Ibom Air's biggest milestone must be the manner in which our brand has been embraced nationally, in such a short time. It is a massive privilege, which we do not take for granted and for which we are totally humbled. We are determined not to let our teeming customers and growing followers down.



Where do you see Ibom air in. the next 10 years and beyond?

We are generally a highly ambitious and audacious company. So when you ask me this question, I fear not to come across as overly ambitious. But in all modesty, we see ourselves 10 years from now, taking pride of place alongside the very best African airlines, with an international profile akin to that of the very best on the continent. Of course, not as big as some of them in the next 10 years, but definitely amongst the very best of them, brand wise. We will be flying all over the continent, offering a safe, reliable, dependable and consistent service to the whole of Africa.

What can you tell us about the new terminal in Uyo, the MRO and Akwa Ibom as an aviation hub?

The investments by the State Government in these two critical, supporting infrastructure projects, are part of the big picture to make Uyo an aviation hub. The MRO will allow us to fully maintain our aircraft right here in Uyo, while offering commercial aircraft maintenance to other airlines. The terminal, which will be the best in Nigeria when completed, is designed to support our homebase hub strategy. Together, the airline, the airport and the MRO will combine to establish Uyo (and by extension Akwa Ibom State) as a repository of aviation industry talent and 'know how', not just for Nigeria, but also for Africa and beyond.

Expansion plans beyond Nigeria?

Definitely. We will venture out into the region in the coming months and will soon extend our footprint throughout the continent. But at this point in time, we do not have any ambitions for long haul operations outside Africa. That's a place, young airlines like us go to die. Instead, we will partner smartly to extend our reach out there through others who are well established. Maybe one day, when we feel sufficiently grown up and ready to venture out into the wider world, we will change our minds. But for now, we will remain true to our vision, which is "To be a World Class, African Regional Airline".

Finally, the question many think about but are not asking: what happens after 2023?

I am not Nostradamus now (laughs). But jokes apart, we get this question all the time.

Our view is that Ibom Air has delivered very well against the expectations of our shareholder, in this very short time. And this is tangible. The benefits of Ibom Air's existence are manifold. For starters, Victor Attah international Airport, Uyo, is the fastest growing airport in Nigeria because of Ibom Air. Because of Ibom Air, so many Akwa Ibomites are now professionals in various areas of the industry, including cabin crew, airline customer service representatives, etc. They mostly wouldn't have had these opportunities in Uyo, if the airline did not exist.

But more than just these, Ibom Air is the first airline in Nigeria to certify Nigerian Aircraft Maintenance Engineers on the Bombardier CRJ900 aircraft, even when we were not the first to use the aircraft type. Among the now 21 young, certified CRJ900 engineers, 15 of them are young Akwa Ibomites, employed fresh out of university engineering school. At the moment, the State government has invested in training the first crop of 10 fresh pilots at the world renowned Airbus Pilot Training Academy in France. These young people are being trained straight as airline pilots and will join Ibom Air upon qualifying in about 2 years time.

On the impact on the local economy, Ibom Air spends billions of Naira in procurement of supplies within Akwa Ibom State yearly, that would never have been spent here if



not for the airline. We have built and grown businesses, which have employed many people in order to keep up with our requirements, such as preparing and supplying our on-board catering and water, etc. Because of the ease of access into Akwa Ibom by air, hotel occupancy in Uyo is at the highest ever. The golf resort and hotels around the State are booming with corporate and association conferences, executive breakaways, group tours, etc on a weekly basis, as never before. The direct and indirect economic spin-offs of this boom in visitors cannot easily be quantified.

Also, the reality of a State Government-owned airline starting-up so professionally and operating so efficiently, has attracted the notice and earned the applause of a significant segment of the traveling and general public. It represents a major change of the game in Nigeria. The feedback and accolades we continue to receive from across the country affirm this sentiment.

Mambilla:

Home to one of Africa's biggest tea plantation

The Mambilla Plateau with an average elevation of 1,600 meters above sea level has a different ambience from the entire northern region, it is endowed with one of the best weather conditions in the country. Providing a perfect backdrop to the holiday of a lifetime. Get to see Nigeria's highest plateau, a spectacular wildlife site which you don't have to be a nature buff to appreciate. Some of Mambilla's wildest and most wonderful spots may only be explored on foot.

Nature trails up into the mountains like the Chappal Waddi peak with a height of 2,419 meters above sea level, is the highest plateau in Nigeria & West Africa and is very well laid out. The Mambilla plateau measures about 40 KM wide and 96 KM along its curve length with an escarpment of about 900 meters high in some places. The Mambilla plateau covers an area of about 9,389 square kilometres.

For a more tranquil experience, plan to visit one of Africa's biggest tea plantation. A magnificent waterfall. Explore numerous historic sites — such as the famous cave in Mbamnga — Ndumyaji Cave. Another spot to look out for is the rock with a giant foot print of an ancient warrior at Kabri, the rock with a horse footprint Hienary, and the historic site of the ancient blacksmith that existed before the modern one at Killa yang.


There is no shortage of choice spots whenever you visit the Mambilla with spectacular wildlife site such as the Ngel Yaki mountain forest and the Ndum-yaji forest that are home to very rare species of birds and trees and have attracted lots of researchers from around the world to Taraba State as the Nature's Gift to the Nation welcomes you.

MALABO: SIGHTS OF THINGS TO COME

eautiful Equatorial Guinea, is one of the smallest countries in Africa located on the Gulf of Guinea, bordered on the north by Cameroon, on the east and on the south by Gabon.

The official language is Spanish and the architectural style of its buildings is reflective of eighteenth-century Spanish Baroque. Speaking to it overwhelming Spanish influence.

Equatorial Guinea has two regions, the mainland region of Río Muni with capital at Bata and the Insular Region with capital at Malabo

Bata

Bata is a port city on the mainland of Equatorial Guinea in Central Africa. A long, palm-fringed esplanade stretches along its waterfront. The colossal, futuristic Freedom Tower overlooks the Gulf of Guinea. The colonial-style Bata Cathedral dates from the 1950s. The city's busy markets sell clothing, crafts, fresh fish and produce. Just outside the center, Bomé is a popular beach lined with restaurants and bars.

Malabo

Capital of Equatorial Guinea

Malabo, on Bioko island, is a port city and the capital of Equatorial Guinea. Spanish colonial architecture includes the neo-Gothic, twin-towered Santa Isabel Cathedral. The dark green Casa Verde is a 19th-century house that was prefabricated in Belgium. The Equatoguinean Cultural Centre has gallery and performance spaces. To the south, densely forested Parque Nacional del Pico Basilé surrounds Pico Basilé Volcano.

The staples of Equatorial Guinea foods, as in all the region's countries, consist of tubers such as cassava, sweet potato and plantain. These products are consumed in various ways, but often boiled or mashed accompanied with meat, fish or vegetable dishes with their sauces. As in all the countries of tropical Africa, "bushmeat" is an integral part of traditional food.

Akwadu

This simple breakfast dish consists of sliced or halved bananas or plantains that are doused in melted butter and shortly baked in the oven until golden. They are usually drizzled with orange and lemon juice, brown sugar, and honey, while the top is typically covered with shredded coconut.

Succotash

Succotash is the widely eaten national dish of Equatorial Guinea. This meal is made of a mixture of corn, lima beans, and tomatoes. It is high in protein and starches, and is a perfect combination of ingredients that covers almost all of your dietary needs in one dish! Southern states in America commonly eat succotash.





The leisurely places allow for more time to look at wildlife and take pictures.

Monte Alen National Park is one of the best places to go hiking and trekking in the country. The steep and rugged terrain makes the climb challenging, yet conquerable.

Travellers may get the chance to meet mandrills, gorillas, forest elephants, and several species of birds along the way. If you are interested in more challenging routes, Pico Malabo is a good choice.

The volcano has a range of secluded hiking trails and has become a popular destination for mountain climbing, too. Malabo Island is another notable trekking spot in Equatorial Guinea where visitors can explore an active volcano's slopes.

Thanks to Equatorial Guinea's rich rain forests and wildlife, safari tours are a popular pastime for visitors. Anstar Safaris offers photography and overland tours where travelers are accompanied by experts in the field.

Its wealth of beaches makes Equatorial Guinea a great destination for swimming. Ureca is quite



popular during the dry season, as turtles come ashore to lay their eggs.

There are rugged cycling opportunities because most of the roads in Equatorial Guinea are unpaved. Renting a bicycle is a great way to familiarize yourself with the culture, surroundings and the locals, but be careful when passing roadblocks and inspection points.

Nkuho Uman is a traditional, ancient Efik/Ibibio custom. You could see it as some sort of special care for new mothers, which can be likened to Mbokpo (Fattening).

Although fattening is the premarital preparation of the bride by her parents before being presented to her groom, it is a mark of honour to the bride's parents as they send a strong message to the groom that they were able to take proper care of their daughter and as such, do not

expect anything less by the man. Nkuho Uman on the other hand is postpartum care by the mother inlaw (mostly the bride's mother), to put her daughter who has just recently delivered a baby through the process of fully assuming her role as a mother. This process however takes a period of two to three months.

During this time, the mother ensures that she guides the new mother to ease into Seat-baths, hot water therapy, which involves soaking a cloth in hot water and using it to massage the new mother's belly. What the new mother needs to eat to help with milk production for the baby's consumption, and even what to wear will be determined by the mother-in-law who is more experienced.

The mother also teaches her how to carry the baby, breastfeeding positions and even sitting positions may look like simple things everyone should know, but



wait until your mother-in-law teaches you the simplest thing as how to sit all over again.

Without a doubt, one of the most recommended foods for new mothers within the Ibibio milieu is Ekpang Nkukwo; made from cocoyam, water yam and fresh leaves, spiced with periwinkle, ikpa enang (what is known as kpomo), fish (either fresh or dry) and most importantly, red oil to give it a relishing taste.

Traditional research has shown that garri, soaked with much water (as seen in the custard container) generates fresh and adequate breast milk for the baby. This we may not learn at Harvard.

Now, Ndom, the clay (popularly known as White-chalk) dissolved with water and applied to the skin as powder help clean, smoothen and revitalize the new mother's skin. The Mkpin (miniskirt), handmade from wrapper material is what the new mother wears to enhance her free movement some of the routines involve a regular body check to determine how healthy she is.

Note that within this period, the mother and the baby go through a thorough routine massage to strengthen and revive the body from the inside out; and this also helps restore the new mother to her original body shape.

All of these are carried out solely for health benefits and have zero fetish implications. It's rather sad that this culture is slowly fading away.

However, it is a thing of pride and quite appreciable to see those who still understand and practice this rich culture.

Otigba Sculpture

This giant Otigba statue is a giant drummer beating an equally gargantuan drum carved in 1980 by Aruba, a then third-year student of IMT and was strategically placed at the junction where Chime Avenue (New Haven) meets Ogui Road. The drummer took over the spot as a landmark for the area and subsequently renamed Otigba Junction.

Along Ninth Mile Expressway is a depiction of the 1949 coal miners' strike. It shows a politician joining a group of miners protesting the condition of the mines. It is believed that about 49 miners were shot dead by the British taskmasters during the famous strike.

ORON MUSEUM

ron museum is a unique representation of the ethnocultural riches of Nigeria. Situated in Oron just opposite the Oron river, the museum was established in 1958 to accommodate eight hundred known ancestral figurines (Ekpu) of the Oron people which are believed to be one of the oldest and finest surviving wood carvings in Africa.

History of Oron Museum

The ancestral figurines referred to as Ekpu by the Oron natives date as far back as the early 19th century. It was all a process whereby an esteemed Oron leader was elevated to ancestral status. The wood sculptures were invoked to play an essential role in assuring the well-being of their offspring. They were seen as protectors and the museum was built to house these precious mini gods.

Unfortunately, during the civil war, the museum was looted and many of the figurines were missing. However, in 1975, Oron museum was reconstructed with the help of British anthropologist Keith Nicklin whose statue is at the entrance of the museum.

Today, Oron museum houses the remains of the wooden sculptures and other ethnographic materials from across Nigeria.

Apart from the Ekpu carvings, Oron museum is also the home of unique skin-covered and horned head masks; the powerful Obasi Njom masquerade from upper Cross River area, old manilla currency, water spirit masquerade relics, traditional raffia and metal works, the traditional pottery. Also, bunkers used during the civil war are on display. These artworks and materials of antiquity inspires your





imaginations and gives you a bit of connection to the Oron culture. The tour guides are good and very knowledgeable narrators, they bring the artworks to life with their excellent storytelling abilities.

Within the premises of the museum is a crafts village. On the site of Oron museum are two de-commissioned oil wells which means the museum grounds were once oilrich. The Oron museum complemented by the freeflowing waters of the Oron river bank is an impeccable combination. Go with friends and family and appreciate the cultural and historical riches of the Oron people.

How to get to Oron Museum?

The closest airport to Oron Museum is the Victor Attah International Airport. Moving from the Airport to Oron Museum is a 45minutes drive, a distance of 37.2 km. More so, commercial buses are available in Oron to convey tourists to the museum location.

Things to do at Oron museum

Contrary to popular opinions that there isn't a lot to do at museums, Oron museum doesn't fit into that space as there are a handful of activities to engage in including:

- **1**. Taking a look at some of the last surviving figurines and other relics.
- 2. Engaging yourself at the crafts village by observing the locals.
- **3** Relaxing at the Oron river waterfront after your museum tour.

urrent WHO guidelines recommend five grams of salt a day for adults, which is just under a teaspoon. However, most people exceed this recommended daily limit by leaps and bounds. If you're used to the rich taste of Nigerian cuisine, then cutting back on salt could seem pretty daunting.

Try these simple hacks to lower your salt intake without skimping on flavour:

1. Cook Your Food Yourself

Most dietary salt comes from eating processed food, so cutting out fast food will get you more than halfway there. This means investing more time into preparing home-cooked meals so you can control how much salt you're adding.

2. Use Fresh Ingredients

The other benefit of making your own food is that you can use the freshest ingredients possible, and we all know that freshness and flavour go hand in hand.

3. Amplify Flavours with Lemon Juice

Adding some lemon juice to your food will brighten it up and enhance the other flavours in the dish. This means less salt overall.

4. Explore the Great, Big World of Vinegar

Like lemon juice, vinegar adds acidity to a dish, and there are so many kinds to choose from. Add flavour and mild acidity to vegetable stir-fries with some rice wine vinegar and replace store-bought dressing with apple cider vinegar and olive oil for your salads.

5. Add Shellfish

Crayfish is a familiar presence in traditional Nigerian cuisine where it adds sweetness and enriches recipes so that you need less salt. However, as the taste of crayfish can be a bit strong, be light-handed with it in continental dishes or add small pieces of shrimps, prawns, crab or lobster instead. Whichever you choose, shellfish packs a punch even when used sparingly.



6. Upgrade your Dish with Garlic

Oh, the wonders that this 'stinking rose' will do to your food! Like shellfish, garlic adds a richness to food that means you can get away with less salt, and even dry, powdered garlic is not half bad either. Note that other alliums such as onions, shallots and spring onions will also spice up your dish, but if you ask me, garlic is king. P.S. It's also excellent in salad dressing!

7. Ditch the stock cubes

Most stock cubes contain lots of refined salt as well as other undesirables such as hydrogenated fat, sugar and preservatives. Additionally, some of these products may contain Monosodium Glutamate or MSG, which is a rather controversial ingredient. Now I'm not saying you should never have Party Jollof made with stock cubes, but there's a big difference between o c c a s i o n a l a n d r e g u l a r consumption.

8. Ditch the Refined Table Salt, Use Sea Salt Instead

Chuck the refined table salt in the same pile as the stock cubes, and opt for sea salt or rock salt instead. Quality really does matter when



you're trying to cut back on salt, and there are various sea salts or rock salts to choose from, which not only taste better than refined table salt, but also contain trace minerals that may be beneficial for health. However, salt is still salt, so season away, but in moderation!

9. Don't Forget Herbs & Spices

Herbs and spices are a great way to add another flavour dimension and cut back on salt. Some herbs such as parsley loose the bulk of their flavour when dried and there's something so special about adding a fresh sprig of rosemary to your cooking. However, feel free to experiment with both fresh and dried herbs and spices depending on what you're trying to create in the kitchen. Herbes de Provence, Chinese Five Spice, curry and jerk will upgrade your home cooked meals, but pay attention to the ingredients in pre-mixed seasonings as some of them are loaded with salt, sugar and additives.

10. Get Acquainted with Toasted Sesame Oil

I just may have saved the best for last! Popular in Asian cuisine, this gem of an ingredient is extremely versatile and will finish up almost any dish by adding a wonderfully delicious, nutty and toasty burst of flavour that's truly unique, whether it's added to salad dressing or drizzled over steamed vegetables or roast chicken. Be sure to buy 'toasted' sesame oil as the untoasted kind wouldn't take your palate places!

Why not try a few of these hacks together in the same recipe? Maybe ditch the stock cubes and add some sea salt, garlic and lemon to your stew instead? You Would Need...

- * 1/4 cup softened unsalted butter
- * 1/4 cup of canola oil
- * 1 cup white granulated sugar
- * 2 eggs
- * 1 tsp vanilla extract
- * 1 1/4 cups overripe banana
- * 1 ½ cups of All-purpose flour
- * 1 tsp baking soda
- * 1 tsp salt
- * 1/2 cup sour cream/ yogurt
- * 1/2 Dark chocolate chips/ chunks
- * 1/2 granola bits

Chocolate Drizzle (optional)

- **1.** Add dark chocolate to a dry stainless bowl and place over hot boiling pot water.
- **2.** Continue to stir until chocolate is completely melted.

3. You can use a piping bag or a spoon to drizzle the chocolate over your banana bread.

Quantity: You can get a loaf and a few cupcakes from this.

Further Instructions

- **1.** Preheat oven to 160 degree Celsius
- **2.** Cream together butter, oil, white sugar, eggs and vanilla extract.
- 3. Mix in mashed banana.
- **4.** Sieve in flour, baking soda and salt and mix with a spatula.
- **5.** Add in sour cream and fold in until well combined.
- **6.** Fold in your granola bits and chocolate chips.
- **7.** Save a little for the top crust.

8. Transfer mix into a loaf pan or dish and bake for 50-60 minutes (depending on your outer crust preference).

- So here are some little tips that could help you.
- 1. Use over ripe bananas.
- 2. Mash your banana throughly.
- 3. Do not over mix your batter
- **4.** Don't open your oven halfway.
- **5.** Wrap your loaf immediately it cools off. Helps retain texture.

- Lemon (In slices)
- Blueberries (split in two)

On children's day 2022, Ibom Air partnered with habitat for humanity – a not-for-profit organization to perform congenital heart surgery on over 20 children.



AND THE ROLE FOR SUSTAINED AKWA IBOM BASED BUSINESSES

Meet Dr. Elijah Akpan – Executive Chairman, Akwa Ibom Investment Corporation (AKICORP).

Could you share with us the general overview of what your role entails? Some of the parastatals under your division, with a focus on the mall?

AKICORP was established by an Act of the Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly in 2012 under a perpetual

succession and signed into law in 2013 by the Executive Governor of the state, with the sole purpose of overseeing the investment portfolio of the state under a single umbrella body. This body, AKICORP functions as a holding company for the government of Akwa Ibom State in all the investments. Part of our responsibility is to enhance the accelerated industrialization agenda of the governor, His Excellency, Mr Udom G. Emmanuel. Amongst other visible investments

such as Ibom Air, we have invested in agricultural, manufacturing, power, housing, and the oil and gas sectors. We serve as watchdogs for Government investments and therefore, are constantly on the lookout for non performing investments or moribund companies owned by the state Government to revive or restore

them back into operation . We own every investment of the State Government like Ibom Air, Ibom Deep Sea Port, etc.

Tropicana Entertainment Center – The Mall as you like to call, is one of such state investments. The State Government owns 25% shares while Investors own the other 75%. It has become a rallying point in the heart of uyo, a one stop shop for groceries, grooming, high and low end shoping as well as fine dining. While Ibom Air brings the visitors and investors into Akwa ibom, the mall offers relaxation and entertainment.

With the influx of people from the airport who need a place to get entertained, what is your message to tourists and intending visitors?

The mall initially was built as an entertainment centre. Even though it had been idle for a couple of years, His Excellency, Governor Udom Emmanuel came up with a vision to turn the idle Mall into a functional and operational entertainment center. To get to where we currently are, firstly the government needed to create access to a modern facility to allow people to come in for



business and leisure. Then began our quest for investors which thankfully, we succeeded in finding one who was not just willing, but capable of Partnering with Government towards developing and turning it into the mall we see today, complete with an entertainment section, and cinema.

We tried to develop the mall to international standard. Akwa Ibom State is one of the states in the country that attracts most investors in and out of the state. We also want the mall to be very attractive to persons within and outside the state. So if you go to Dubai, Las Vegas, Paris, Washington DC or London, or any of the stores in the malls you visit, you should be able to have the replicant of their brand here in Nigeria.

What is your function in AKICORP as the Chairman.

The Akwa Ibom Investment Corporation has three Directorates. Under these Directorates, we have different departments in charge of diverse responsibilities.

Firstly we have the Operations Directorate under which we have Investment Promotion and Appraisal Department; which takes care of all the investment promotion activities within and outside of the state, both Foreign and Domestic Direct Investments.

Secondly, the Project Monitoring and Implementation Department; in charge of ensuring that any investment that comes in, is followed and supervised from conception to implementation and production.

a department that takes care of new businesses, and also takes to the public useful information, and ensures they plan for recurrent trade shows and trade missions. This is Entrepreneurship and Business Development Department. We also have Agricultural Investment Directorate and Management Services Directorates. We have done a lot of trade seminars in the past years where all the micro and medium ventures were represented. We also do a lot of advertisement in

international fora, several media outlets and newspapers.

I'm a Licensed Clinical Pharmacist by profession, trained in the USA, went to the University of Southern California in Los Angeles, California, graduated, and then went straight into practice. A few years later, started a business in the medical field and I did that for about 15 years before taking up an appointment as the Executive Chairman of Akwa Ibom Investment Corporation in 2015. I owned several other businesses prior, and won several awards in the US. I lived in Las Vegas, Nevada and was a Clinical Pharmacy Consultant and an honorary member of the City Council.

I am a Christian, married with five children. I have been blessed and I give all the glory to God. Currently amongst others, I also serve as the Chairman of Champion Breweries Plc., Anchor Insurance Co. Ltd., etc.




